

PENGUIN CHICKS DELIGHT FOLLY FARM



Folly Farm is thrilled to announce the arrival of five adorable baby Humboldt penguin chicks, marking the first hatchings at the zoo since 2021.

Keepers at Folly Farm have resumed breeding Humboldt penquins as part of a carefully managed European Breeding Programme, facilitated by the zoo's membership with the European Association of Zoos and Aquariums (EAZA). These chicks represent the first new additions to the penguin colony in three years, making their arrival a cause for celebration.

Humboldt penguins, classified as a vulnerable species, face numerous threats in their natural habitat. Breeding efforts had been temporarily halted at Folly Farm, making the arrival of these chicks particularly significant. The dedicated keepers are overjoyed to once again contribute to the conservation of these charismatic birds.

The fluffy newcomers are growing rapidly under the attentive care of both parents, who take turns feeding them while the other enjoys a refreshing swim in the pool. It's a heartwarming sight to witness these tiny chicks double or even triple in weight every few days. In a few weeks, they will outgrow their nest boxes and be transferred to the Penguin Nursery facility, where experienced keepers will guide

them in learning to feed on whole fish and navigate the waters of their small 'baby pool', before joining the main pool with the rest of the colony.

Adding a touch of whimsy to the occasion, this year's naming theme for the penguin chicks is cheese. Meet Mozzarella, Camembert, Cheddar, Halloumi, and Gorgonzola-the newest members of the Folly Farm family. Penguin Keeper and Assistant Zoo Manager Caz Davies expressed her excitement, highlighting the anticipation of discovering each chick's gender as they mature.

The journey began with Mozzarella, hatching on 30 March to proud parents Magnum and Feast, followed by Camembert on 2 April, born to Perci and Puffy. Cheddar made his debut on 5 May, welcomed by Whippy and Pippy, while Halloumi joined the fold on 10 May, under the care of first-time parents Einstein and Darwin. The youngest addition, Gorgonzola, entered the world on 14 May, with Popple and Pudding as proud parents.

Currently, Penguin Coast is home to 22 Humboldt and 14 Macaroni penguins. While guests eagerly await the opportunity to meet the newest arrivals, Folly Farm encourages everyone to stay updated through their website and social media platforms for the latest news and adorable penguin updates.



Local supporters gathered to witness the unveiling of the new bar and cozy 'cwtch' area, marking the latest milestone in the building's redevelopment.





JOSEPH IS A GREAT ADVERTISEMENT FOR THE YARD ABC

When Joseph Felice came runner-up in his weight category at the recent Welsh Amateur Boxing Championship at Ebbw Vale Sports Centre there was naturally a measure of disappointment but it was linked to a deserved sense of pride because he had boxed really well to win his semi-final the day before.

Joseph trains three times a week with coaches Kenneth Owen and Rowland George at The Yard ABC in Letterston and they are very quick to sing his praises and Kenneth told us soon afterwards, "Joseph is a great advertisement for our sport because he is totally committed, sets the pace in training and hasn't let some earlier defeats upset him: Indeed, they have simply made him even more determined to box on and train even harder '

FAMILY MATTERS . . .

Joseph isn't your typical 17 yearold in this tough sport because he is very analytical about his boxing - and readily admits that he played rugby until he was entering his teens but then stopped taking part because he found it too physical for him at that time

So, he didn't take part in any sport for a while but sometimes pretended to 'square up' to his father John at home, who was a very good hooker or flanker for Haverfordwest and eventually played international rugby for Malta, the birthplace of his father

His uncle Phil played prop for Haverfordwest and Malta; and he says Phil and his auntie Cheryl are others who have given him every encouragement.

Joseph's dad and mum Faye - and big sister Mia, who plays hockey for Pembrokeshire, encouraged him to go to a boxing club and it was mum who messaged coach Kenneth and he

was soon being driven there from the family home in Clarbeston Road to try it out

A NERVOUS START

"I was a bit nervous," admitted Joseph, "and to be honest I was quite clumsy, especially with regard to the skipping which starts the sessions but I've learned since to get the sense of rhythm that it needs and find it a great way to warm-up.

"Pretty soon I started to get a grip of things with all the equipment and also in sparring and began to gain in confidence because the coaches are brilliant and didn't try to hurry me along, which I really appreciated - and it took me about a year before I decided I was ready to apply for the medical card which meant I could start thinking about taking part in boxing.

"So, I had my medical, filled out all the forms and within a fortnight it was back, telling me I could now take part in amateur bouts under the rules of the Welsh Amateur Boxing Association

THREE DEFEATS TO 'GOOD FRIEND' WILL

Joseph's first bout came in the Welsh Novices Championships in Swansea and after receiving a bye in the semi-final he took on Will Mather, of Gwynfi ABC, who had already boxed a few times.

"The first round went well but right at the end I got caught by a punch that the referee thought was too good for me and he stopped the fiaht







REMEMBERING CAPTAIN THOMAS

Feel Good SNIPPETS

Thanks to a Pembrokeshire aviation historian, a World pilot and former War I Regiment officer, Welsh long forgotten, has been commemorated. His memorial stone has been renovated, and family members have been traced.

Malcolm Cullen, of Marloes, first spotted pilot's wings on the memorial at Llanion town cemetery, Pembroke Dock, but had difficulty in deciphering the inscription.

The impressive cross, set on a Cornish granite plinth, was placed by the family of Captain Benjamin Stewart Buckingham Thomas, MC, of Gwyther Street, Pembroke Dock, who died on October 4th 1918 when two RAF Bristol Fighter biplanes collided. He was 24.

Captain Thomas served as a Welsh Regiment infantry officer on the Western Front and was awarded the Military Cross for

heroism during the Battle of La Boiselle, part of the Somme offensive of 1916.

In 1917 he trained as a pilot and joined 11 Squadron RAF, flying many operational patrols in 1918. He died just weeks before the war ended and is buried at Greviller Cemetery, France.

Malcolm has restored the memorial area and arranged for a stonemason to revamp the inscription. His researches locally traced the pilot's nephew, Mr Benjamin Stewart-Thomas, who lives near Broad Haven.

Mr Stewart-Thomas and his wife, Judith, attended the service of re-dedication, conducted by Air Cadets Padre Rev Grayham Passmore. The memorial was unveiled by the Mayor of Pembroke Dock, Councillor George Manning, assisted by Deputy Mayor Councillor Maria Williams.

During his trip, he plans to document his routes and share photos on his Coast to Coast website.

"Chris was spotted all over the place, but we were unable to capture him," he explained.

He transported Chris back home in his van, and upon release, DiRhea rushed over to reunite with her partner. Alleyne shared that the pair has been inseparable since, bringing the ordeal to a heartwarming conclusion.



When the internet buzz first announced another instalment in the "Omen" franchise, I have to admit I was somewhat not bothered about the who, whys and where's to be honest.

Nearly two decades post the poorly-received "Omen" remake with Julia Stiles and Liev Schreiber, the announcement of a prequel film from 20th Century Studios under the Walt Disney Corporation banner seemed like an exercise in franchise milking.

"The First Omen" was to delve into the origins of Damien, the son of Lucifer, who was unwittingly adopted by American diplomat Robert Thorn (Gregory Peck) and his wife Kathy (Lee Remick) in Richard Donner's 1976 classic. The parents, deceived into

LAND LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES AT TEGRYN

A new initiative in Pembrokeshire, north Hwb Dysgu'r Tir, located in Tegryn near Crymych, is set to offer farmers food producers and the chance to upskill, along with volunteering opportunities for the local community.

Led by Cwm Arian Renewable Energy, this program provides training comprehensive courses in sustainable land management and volunteering options.

As a social enterprise, Hwb Dysgu'r Tir is dedicated to promoting sustainable land stewardship, catering specifically to farmers, food producers, land managers, and rural communities in west Wales. The initiative offers unique professional development and skill enhancement opportunities in areas such as sustainable land management practices, food production, natural crafts, and nature recovery.

The venture has received funding, notably from the UK Government's Shared Prosperity Fund, to establish itself as a social enterprise.

"Amidst the growing to address urgency challenges environmental resilient and build communities, Hwb Dysqu'r Tir is committed to empowering individuals with the knowledge and tools necessary to adapt, build capacity, and reconnect with the land," said a



spokesperson for Cwm Arian.

Situated on a two-acre site in Tegryn, the initiative will serve as the main base for courses, workshops, and volunteer opportunities. The site is being developed as a demonstration area featuring zones for agroecological land practices, food production, and spaces including a dye garden and willow coppice.
