RICHARDS AND NEWMAN TRIUMPH AS DAVIES CLOSES IN ON RECORD



RICHARDS AND **NEWMAN SHINE AGAIN**

Champions were once again crowned as Haverfordwest Club staged the finals of the 76th annual senior Pembrokeshire County Open.

Tom Richards, a finalist last year, beat Marco Coronado to claim the men's singles title for the third time in his playing career, the other two coming back in 2015 and 2016.

Haverfordwest head coach Richards cruised through the rounds but was firmly tested in the final by Coronado, who received semi-final walkover following the retirement of 2022 champion Mathieu Evans.

Richards took a close first set 6-4 before claiming the second 6-2.

Sarah Newman defended her ladies singles title for the third year running with a 6-1 6-0 victory over fellow former Welsh athletics hurdler Vicky Lloyd.

Lloyd had only taken up the sport a year ago and took out 2021 champion Ceri Coleman-Phillips in a superb semi-final comeback, while Newman once again showed her class.



DOUBLES SUCCESS AND BIG NUMBERS

Richards Both Newman also enjoyed success in the doubles finals.

Richards and Nathan Jones won the men's title without having to hit a ball after Evans and dad Bruce were forced to withdraw through injury ahead of Saturday's final.

Ladies doubles winners - Sarah Newman and Laura DaviesNewman once again joined forces with Laura Davies who returned to the tournament after injury in 2024. The formidable pair overpowered team mates Sarah Keogh and Coleman-Phillips, but the 6-0 6-1 scoreline still provided plenty of entertainment for the

It was Davies' 24th Open title, bringing her to within one of Danny Spurr's record of 25. There is little doubt she will break that and be officially crowned "The GOAT" in the not too distant future.

MIXED DRAMA AND FIRST-TIME WINS

Newman and Coleman-Phillips would meet again in the mixed doubles final, a title Coleman-Phillips had won with Jeremy Cross for the past four years, but the eight-time champion was a missed figure this year as he travels the world with his family.

Coronado stepped in to replace Cross and the pair took on Newman and Jones in one of the closest mixed finals in recent years.

Coronado and Coleman-Phillips took the first set 7-5 but were pushed all the way in the second to set up a tiebreak. Despite trailing 5-1, they held their nerve to claim victory.

It was the first and deserved title for Coronado who had been a spectator favourite throughout the tournament with his effortless and powerful playing style.

PLATES, TIE-BREAKS AND WHAT'S NEXT

The plate finals were played prior to Saturday, with Jones edging the athletic William Howarth 7-5 7-5. It had been a coming of age for Jones who was arguably the standout doubles player of the tournament.

Teenage surfing superstar Josie Hawke lifted the ladies plate after a hard battle with Chloe Tickle, emerging a 6-4 7-6 winner.

Tickle also featured in the ladies' doubles plate final with Liz Reed, with the inexperienced duo pushing ladies' second team pair Helen Groves and Ceri O'Shea all the way to a championship tie-break, which they eventually lost

Marco Coronado and Ceri Coleman-Phillips - mixed doublesIt was a solid display by Groves and O'Shea who held their nerve to claim the inaugural title.

The men's doubles plate final was one of the most entertaining matches of the fortnight, and that too came down to a championship tie-break.

Club chairman Dean Richards and Andy Beazley came from behind to take the first set 7-6, but Bryan Phillips and David Roch James regathered their composure to win the second 6-4.

Richards and Beazley produced their best tennis when it mattered to win the tie-break.

Club president Brian Hearne was once again on hand to present the trophies and thank the tournament referee and all the volunteers for their hard work.

They will all be back out in force later this month as the Parade gets ready to host the Junior County Open from 13-19 July, featuring the best young talent around, and also the club's 90th anniversary celebration on 26 July.



This classic glazed gammon dish, served with a rich, tangy salad cream and an assortment of fresh vegetables, makes an ideal centrepiece for a summer lunch or buffet spread.

Here's how to prepare each component to perfection.

Testing and Preparing the Gammon

Before cooking, it's important to test the saltiness of the gammon. Cut a thin slice from the end of the raw joint and simmer it in a small pan of water for about 5 minutes. Taste the cooked slice-if it's overly salty, soak the entire gammon joint in cold water overnight to reduce the salt content.

Cooking the Gammon

Place the gammon joint in a large pan and pour in cider, then add enough cold water to fully cover the meat. Add a handful of whole peppercorns, a few cloves, a pinch of chilli flakes, and a couple of bay leaves. Bring everything to a boil, then skim off any foam that forms on the surface. Immediately reduce the heat to a gentle simmer, half-cover the pan with a tid, and cook for 11/2 to 2 hours.

The ham is done when its internal temperature reaches 65°C (150°F) when checked with a meat probe. Once cooked, turn off the heat and allow the gammon to cool completely in the cooking liquid.



Making the Salad Cream

While the gammon cooks, you can prepare the salad cream. In a heatproof bowl, whisk together eggs, a little plain flour, sugar, and a pinch of salt. In a small saucepan, bring vinegar to a boil and reduce by half, then slowly whisk it into the egg mixture.

Set the bowl over a pan of gently simmering water, ensuring the base of the bowl doesn't touch the water. Stir the mixture with a wooden spoon for about 5 minutes until it thickens. Remove from the heat and let it cool, then stir in some double cream. Taste and adjust the seasoning with salt, lemon juice, or a dash of Tabasco if desired. If the cream is too thick, loosen it with a tablespoon or two of water. Store the finished salad cream in a jam jar in the fridge until ready to use.

Glazing and Roasting the Ham

What does it go with?

To make your meal complete let the

(180°C Fan)/Gas 6.

To make the glaze, combine a spoonful of mustard with an egg yolk, a little cornflour, and honey. Once the gammon is cool enough to handle, remove it from the cooking liquid. Snip off the string, and using a sharp knife, carefully remove the rind, leaving a thin layer of fat (about 3-4mm or 1/8

Brush the fat with the glaze, then press a coating of breadcrumbs firmly onto the surface. Bake the ham for 10 to 15 minutes until golden and crisp. Allow to cool completely before



Porridge, Pancakes & Perfect Plates Bringing Riviera vibes to the Welsh coast Our very own Tim Evans takes a tasty tour

Now that the weather

is really warming up, I was out and about delivering our latest magazine, and Saturday took me to Fishguard and Goodwick. After delivering along the Golden Mile, the one-way system brought me back to the square, where I noticed there was seating outside Cove Corner. Many of the tables were full, but I spotted a small one for me and my two sons - somewhere to fuel up and keep us going while we dropped off FeelGood magazine at the many shops and pubs.

It was breakfast time. We each opted something different from the menu. First up was the Full English - or Welsh, as it's listed on the menu. Thick-cut butcher's bacon, cooked well done and deliciously salty - exactly what you'd want on your plated brekkie. Then the sausages - two thick butcher's sausages, herby and full of flavour. Two fried eggs with the most vivid orange yolks that just screamed "free range". On-



the-vine tomatoes, sweet and bursting with flavour, and thick white toast that soaked up all the remains of the bean juice. Honestly, this was the best breakfast I've had in a long time.

We also had the Nutella pancakes – stacked in a tower in the middle of the plate and drenched in gooey chocolate sauce, with shavings and chunks of Kinder Bueno neatly arranged around the

JOYCE-BUTCHERS HITS 50TH CAP



Pembrokeshire's community is bursting with pride this week as local hero Jasmine Joyce-Butchers earns her 50th cap for the Wales women's national team, taking to the field against Australia this Friday in Sydney.

The milestone marks another major achievement in a career that continues to inspire fans both locally and across the rugby

Born in St Davids on 9 October 1995, Joyce-Butchers has become one of the most recognisable figures in Welsh rugby.

A flying winger renowned for her blistering pace, quick feet, and finishing ability, she began her rugby journey at just seven years old with St Davids RFC. Her talent and determination soon saw her rise through the ranks, playing for Haverfordwest RFC, before joining the Scarlets Under-18s-where she scored a hat-trick on debut against the Dragons.

She first represented Wales Sevens in 2015 and made her senior XVs debut in 2017. Her explosive form earned her selection for Team GB at the 2016 Rio Olympics, where she became the only Welsh woman in the squad. She returned for Tokyo 2021, and earlier this summer, made history again by representing Team GB in Paris 2024, becoming the first British

woman to compete at three Olympic Games in rugby sevens.

Now aged 29 and playing club rugby for Bristol Bears, Joyce-Butchers reaches her 50th cap in a crucial summer Test series. The Welsh Rugby Union recognised the milestone this week, with head coach Sean Lynn confirming her place in the starting lineup for the second Test against the Wallaroos. Wales go into the match riding high after a 21-12 victory in Brisbane last weekend-their first away win in over 800 days. Joyce-Butchers played a key role in that historic result, once again demonstrating the talent and leadership that define her game.

Educated at Ysgol Dewi Sant, she remains deeply rooted in her local community and continues to serve as an inspiration to aspiring athletes across Pembrokeshire. Her journey from local tag rugby sessions to the international stage is a powerful reminder of what can be achieved through hard work, passion, and perseverance.

As the 2025 Rugby World Cup approaches, Joyce-Butchers shows no sign of slowing down. Whether representing Wales in the XVs or dazzling crowds on the sevens circuit, she continues to push boundaries and break new ground-not just celebrating a personal milestone, but carving out a lasting legacy in the sport.





A plan to install a summer house and garden shed in a wildflower and wildlife field near a Grade II-listed Georgian property in Wolfscastle has been given the green light by Pembrokeshire County Council.

At the council's planning committee meeting on July 29, members unanimously approved an application by Dr Andrew John Williams for the installation of a wooden shed/ summer house at Ty Rhos

The structure will serve dual purposes—storing garden tools and offering a space for leisure activities such as reading, writing, and observing wildlife. It is to be located in a field on the property that has been carefully developed over the last four years to support biodiversity, including the planting of trees, wildflowers, and the growing of fruit and vegetables.

The chosen site sits over 100 metres from the main house and is not visible from it, minimising any impact on the historic for concrete foundations and setting. Although the shed

may be lightly visible from a nearby road (around 26 metres away), this visibility is expected An officer report concluded to reduce as surrounding

vegetation matures. In keeping with conservation principles, the shed will be built from sustainable materials and supported on a drybase system—avoiding the need

ensuring no existing trees will be disturbed.

GARDEN SHED APPROVED AT WOLFSCASTLE

that the development would be in keeping with the character of the area and would have no adverse effect on the heritage value of Ty Rhos House. The report also confirmed that the proposal complies with the Historic Environment Wales

Act 2023 and relevant local planning policies, subject to conditions controlling the use of the building.

The recommendation for conditional approval was proposed by Cllr Brian Hall and unanimously supported by the planning committee.

PEMBROKESHIRE SCHOOL WINS INTERNATIONAL AWARD



Haverfordwest is celebrating being after awarded an internationally acclaimed eco-

Prendergast CP School has been awarded their third Green Flag Award thanks to the environmental education programme, Eco-Schools.

Eco-Schools is an international programme run in Wales by environmental charity, Keep Wales Tidy and funded by the Welsh Government. Over 90% of schools in Wales are registered on the programme.

The Eco-Schools programme inspires and empowers pupils to be leaders of change in their community, helping them learn about sustainable living and global citizenship while giving them the information and support they need to make changes that will benefit their school, local environment and wider community, such as reducing energy consumption, transport, healthy living and litter

As part of their Eco-Schools assessment, Prendergast CP School undertook an ambitious and wideranging biodiversity project to transform the school grounds into a richer habitat for wildlife.

Pupils and staff worked closely with local and national organisations, including the Darwin Centre, who supported the school in carrying out extensive biodiversity surveys and helped to plan the project; the Pembrokeshire Nature Partnership, who provided expert advice and guidance; and Keep Wales Tidy, who supplied vital resources and support through their Supersize Development Package.

The school also shared ideas and good practice with another process. With the help of these partners, pupils planted large areas of pollinator-friendly native plants and wildflowers, enhanced existing habitats and created new spaces to support insects, birds and small mammals. The pond area was significantly improved to encourage greater biodiversity and provide inspiring outdoor learning opportunities.

In addition to the biodiversity work, the school established a Big Bocs Bwyd 'Pay As You Feel' shop to help reduce food waste, improve access to nutritious food and support the wellbeing of families.

The initiative has also created opportunities for parents to get involved in food growing, cooking and enterprise activities. Other projects included promoting active travel to school, organising regular litter picks, introducing composting for food and garden waste and installing a water butt to collect rainwater for the school garden. These actions are helping pupils build practical skills and confidence while learning about sustainability and their role in caring for the

Ms Louise John, head teacher of Prendergast CP School, said:

"We are incredibly proud to have achieved our third Green Flag award through Eco-Schools Wales. This recognition is a testament to the passion, hard work, and commitment of our pupils, staff, and wider school community in caring for our environment. MOTIVE TRENDS TO WATCH FOR 2025

the midst of a transformative shift, with 2025 set to be a landmark year for innovation and sustainability. 


