The centrepiece of the Riverside Winter Fair will be the culmination of a unique community project - the performance of a brandnew Cantata titled "The Children of St Saviours." Composed by Alex McGee, with help from students at Haverfordwest High, will tell the captivating story of Haverfordwest's rich history, drawing inspiration from recent archaeological discoveries at Western Quayside. Alex who hails from Haverfordwest said "this will be a musical work born of the community, performed by the community for the community" The Cantata will be performed by a children's choir, the Cantabile Singers of Pembrokeshire, and the



County Orchestra.

The Riverside Winter Fair promises a day filled with entertainment for the whole family. Pure West Radio will be broadcasting live, capturing the excitement and sharing local voices with the airwaves. "The Riverside Christmas Fair promises to be a truly spectacular day of celebrations for the whole family, and Pure West Radio can't wait to be a part of the excitement," said Pure West Radio's Station

Manager, Toby Ellis. "The lineup of entertainment and events throughout the day is truly outstanding, and Pure West is extremely privileged to be a part of the day."

Witness a banner procession led by the South Wales Police Brass Band, featuring banners created by local primary school children during workshops this autumn. Led by Span Arts: "Span is thrilled to facilitate the Winter Fair banner-making workshops. With a rich history of community art, we're excited to create banners for each of the 5 wards."

Downloadable flag templates and ideas will be available on the event website for any child who wants to create their own flag and participate in the parade.

#### **CELEBRATIONS FOR LITTLE AND BROAD HAVEN LIFEBOAT STATION**



Little and Broad Haven Lifeboat Station recently celebrated two significant milestones: a grand reopening following extensive refurbishment and a special visit as part of the RNLI's 200th anniversary celebrations.

Last month RNLI volunteers, supporters, and crew members gathered to mark the official reopening of the lifeboat station after major refurbishment work completed over the winter months. The updated facilities, designed to bring the station into the 21st century, were inaugurated with a ribbon-cutting ceremony performed by the children of the operational crew and supporters. This heartwarming gesture symbolised the passing of responsibility to the next generation of lifesavers.

Lifeboat Operations Manager Andy Grey expressed pride in the station's transformation and the event's success: "The station opening was extremely successful. The weather was kind, and we had personnel from the station, including officers and crew, branch members, and shop volunteers, in attendance, along with guests from neighbouring RNLI stations. The occasion truly represented the 'One Crew' philosophy. Inviting the children of the crew to formally open the refurbished station was a lovely gesture and created a memorable

The refurbished station now boasts state-of-the-art facilities, including a modernised lifeboat shop that will enhance working conditions for the dedicated volunteers.

Anjie Rook, RNLI Associate Director overseeing the 200th anniversary programmes, remarked, "The Connecting our Communities relay is one of the most significant events of the RNLI's 200th anniversary year as it focuses on our people. For 200 years, it has been the people who have made the RNLI what it is—from our brave lifesavers who risk their lives to save others to the committed fundraisers and generous donors who support our lifesaving work." Coincidentally, the RNLI Porsche

911 Challenge also arrived at the station on the same day. Belinda and James Richardson, who are undertaking an 8,500-mile journey in their Porsche 911 to visit all 238 RNLI lifeboat stations within 911 hours, were excited to encounter the scroll for the first time on their journey. The couple aims to raise funds for a new D-class inshore lifeboat, which is critical to the RNLI's lifesaving efforts. In 2023 alone, D-class lifeboats saved 96 lives and assisted over 2,000 people in distress.

Reflecting on the unique timing of the two events, Andy Grey said, Today we had a special visit from the RNLI 911 Challenge and the RNLI Scroll. The coincidence of both events occurring on the same day was remarkable. The beautiful Porsche from the 911 Challenge even presented a jigsaw and a special RNU-themed version of Top Trumps as a keepsake from their visit. Four members from the station were asked to sign this wonderful scroll, creating a lasting memory of the RNLI's 200-year celebration."

Jayne George, RNLI Director of Fundraising, expressed gratitude for the Richardsons' efforts: "We are so thankful to Belinda and James for taking on this significant challenge. We look forward to welcoming them at all our lifeboat stations along the coast. Our ability to save lives at sea relies on the generous support of individuals undertaking challenges like this,"

As the RNLI marks 200 years of saving lives at sea, Little and Broad Haven Lifeboat Station continues to play a vital role in this enduring mission, bolstered by new facilities and a strong sense of community spirit as it moves forward into the

### **CRESSWELL QUAY SET FOR CONSERVATION STATUS**



designate Cresswell Quay, one of south Pembrokeshire's most scenic villages and home to the award-winning Cresselly Arms pub, as a conservation area are expected to be approved this month.

Pembrokeshire July, Coast National Park members supported launching a public consultation to assess the village's conservation status. Cresswell Quay, a former coal port, is noted for its architectural significance and historic importance.

The consultation received no objections, although there were suggestions to expand the area to include nearby woodland. Designation would introduce controls on building demolitions and offer greater protection for trees. Officials believe the village's relationship with the estuary and surrounding woods adds to its unique character.

National Park members are expected to formally approve the conservation area status, with a draft appraisal and management plan expected in early 2025.



### **KEEL LAYING CEREMONY FOR NEW PILOT BOAT**



A significant milestone was reached at the Port of Milford Haven in October with the keel-laying ceremony for its new 22-metre pilot transfer vessel. Currently being built by Next Generation Shipyards, this vessel marks the first step in a multi-million-pound investment to enhance the Port's pilotage services.

The keel-laying ceremony, traditionally marking the start of a ship's construction, underscores the Port's ongoing commitment to improving safety, reliability, and operational efficiency. This state-of-the-art vessel will play a crucial role in maintaining the high standards of pilotage at the UK's leading energy port.

#### WHY THE PUB TRADE?


For Paula and Llyr, the decision to enter the pub trade was born out of a desire to work together on something meaningful. "We wanted to do something together,"



are part of a major support programme being offered by National Grid Electricity Distribution (NGED) to customers in South Wales.

The company is providing £500,000 through its Community Matters Fund, available to charities and community groups involved in initiatives such as:

- · Distributing warm packs or energy efficiency items like blankets, radiator keys, insulated curtains, and draught excluders.
- · Visiting isolated households to help improve home warmth and energy efficiency.
- · Running warm spaces in community buildings.
- Enhancing the energy efficiency of community buildings used as warm spaces.

Offering advice switching. savings, energy winter fuel discounts, or other ways to combat fuel poverty. Registered charities or non-profit companies can apply for grants of up to £5,000, while smaller charitable organizations without a charity number can apply for up to £2,000. The application deadline is 5pm on Friday, 1 November.

Ellie Patey, NGED's Community Engagement Manager, emphasized



the importance of projects with long-term impacts, such as helping people sustainably reduce their energy bills. She encouraged applications from grassroots organizations in disadvantaged areas, particularly those serving underrepresented and marginalized

#### WINTER SUPPORT INITIATIVES

In addition to grants, NGED runs eight fuel poverty schemes across its four licence areas: South Wales, the South West, and the East and West

Midlands. These schemes provide personalized support to combat fuel poverty, such as the "Power Up" and "Affordable Warmth" initiatives. These connect South Wales residents with organizations like the Energy Saving Trust and Care & Repair Cardiff and The Vale, which offer advice on benefits, fuel tariff switching, bill payment options, and practical energy efficiency tips.

Last year, over 23,000 customers benefited from these initiatives, resulting in £23 million in savings. NGED is expanding its winter support efforts this year through

partnerships with organizations such as the Warm Welcome Campaign, which supports 4,000 community-based warm spaces. This partnership will provide volunteer training, champion these spaces, and connect people to longer-term fuel poverty schemes.

NGED is also working with the Fuel Bank Foundation, which offers fuel vouchers to those in crisis, and Kidney Care UK, which provides specialized support for kidney disease patients.

#### PRIORITY SERVICES REGISTER

NGED encourages customers with extra needs to join its Priority Services Register (PSR). Over 2.45 million customers have already signed up, including those who rely on electricity for medical equipment, individuals with long-term illnesses, disabilities, pensioners, and parents or carers of young children. PSR members receive dedicated support during power cuts, with access to a special helpline and updates on power restoration. During prolonged outages, NGED partners with the British Red Cross and the National Caterers Association to provide hot food and welfare





### PRESS RELEASE: ALL ABOARD THE ARC

Clynfyw Care Farm in Abercych has been offering a community apple juicing service in Pembrokeshire north since 2014.

Starting small, the service has grown steadily each year, and last year they processed over 11,000 bottles of juice for around 170 people.

"It's a simple system," explained Jim Bowen from Clynfyw. "People bring in their apples, we juice, pasteurise, and bottle them, so they can enjoy the juice for up to a year. Apples don't store well, but juicing preserves their goodness and prevents waste. After ten years, the only challenge we face is managing the overwhelming demand. We were close to becoming victims of our own success."

Clynfyw Care Farm supports ten adults with learning disabilities and offers a day service for around 25 others, all of whom participate in various farm-based activities. These include vegetable growing, making vermicompost, producing charcoal in the summer, and apple juicing in the autumn. Each project is tailored to the participants' interests, and many eagerly anticipate the juicing season. However,

this year, the wet spring, low bee populations, poor pollination, and adverse weather in September have drastically reduced the apple

"In previous years, we'd have made a couple of thousand bottles by now," said Jim. "This year, we've barely done a thousand. The trees have fewer apples, and the ones we do have are much smaller. It's concerning, not just for apples but for other soft fruits and seasonal crops too.'

Pension Credit is a valuable benefit designed to provide extra financial support to older people, worth on average £3,900 per year.

In addition to the financial top-up, Pension Credit unlocks access to a range of additional benefits, including Winter Fuel Payments to help with heating costs, reductions in Council Tax, and assistance with NHS services such as dental care and glasses. For those aged over 75, Pension Credit also grants eligibility for a free TV licence, further alleviating living costs.

One of the advantages of Pension Credit is that it can be backdated by up to three months, provided you were entitled to it during that period. This means you could receive payments for up to three months prior to your application date. However, if you're applying online, make sure to specifically request that your

claim is backdated to ensure you receive what you're entitled to.

To check if you qualify for Pension Credit, you can contact the Pension Service or visit their official website at www.gov. uk/pension-credit/eligibility. Applying is straightforward, and you can do so online or by calling 0800 99 1234. Telephone lines are open Monday to Friday, from 8am to 6pm. When applying, be prepared with key information such as your National Insurance number, your partner's details (if applicable), and any relevant information about your income

"It was so exciting to see the schools, colleges, communities and local businesses come together to experience the ARC and all aquaculture has to offer for our land and seas."



## **KNOCK-OFF NESSA IS RIDING HIGH**

Kaz Barrett, who goes by Knock Off Ness, said her life has been "absolutely mental" since the final Gavin and Stacey episode was announced

A carer has said her life has been turned upside after embracing a striking resemblance to one of the UK's best-loved TV characters.

Kaz Barrett, from Barry, Vale of Glamorgan, said her hairdresser believes Gavin and Stacey co-creator Ruth Jones must have based the character of Nessa on her.

After beginning work as a professional impersonator in 2019, she said demand has exploded in recent months as Gavin and Stacey mania sweeps the nation ahead of the show's final episode.

Her bookings include Barry Island coach tours and pub crawls, student club nights and even one upcoming funeral.

"It's been immense, my life has been completely turned upside down," said Kaz.

Shortly after the announcement of the show's return. Kaz told BBC Wales how much Gavin and Stacey means to Barry

Kaz first became Nessa in 2019. when the real Ruth Jones visited Barry to turn on the Christmas lights.

Such was the interest in seeing the star, Kaz described the event as "a disaster, an absolute logistic nightmare".

"It's only a small square, and over 5,000 people turned up," she said, joking: "They're not even allowed to invite her back up again." But the massive popularity of

the evening was the spur for Kaz's unlikely new role.

"I was running a little local charity cafe on the high street... so I dressed up as Nessa as a joke and ran up and down the street," she said.

"The video went viral, everybody loved it, and I thought 'oh, hang on a minute, there's something, here'."

Knock Off Nessa was born, and she since amassed tens of thousands of followers on social media.

Kaz, 47, who still works as a carer, said after the viral video, she was approached by a lookalikes agency.

Now, five years into the role, she hosts tours for two companies in character, and does events and appearances, including some more unusual than others.

"I got a funeral to go to on Friday," she said.

"I said yes because the guy who passed away was a massive Gavin and Stacev fan.

"He always used to say to me 'can I be Bryn, can we sing Islands in the Stream?'. So when he passed, I said to his sister that I'd love to come down and do it for him."

She added that the show is still so popular with young audiences she's often asked to do nightclub appearances, often for students.

"I turned up to a nightclub in Bristol and the event was for me to throw burgers at the students off a fire escape," she said.

"When I got down on the fire escape, they were all going 'I saw the way to threw that burger at me Ness, it was lush'."


The vessel was suffering from electrical issues, and after an unsuccessful attempt to rectify the issue the yachts crew contacted the coastquard for
